GOVERNING BODIES AND RULE BOOKS

Equestrian Vaulting USA (EVUSA) and **United States Equestrian Federation (USEF)** have recognized this competition with Ascent Equestrian Vaulting, Inc. as USEF Licensee. The competition is governed by the current rules and regulations of USEF and EVUSA. Unrecognized classes will be governed by the specifications in this Colorado State Summer Vaulting Fest Prize List printed herein. If needed due to time constraints, alternate judges, not listed, may judge classes.

All questions not covered in the applicable USEF or EVUSA rules and regulations, or the additional rules in this Prize List, shall be decided by the Show Management and the decision will be final, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Note: There are always many new rules. Please read the EVUSA and USEF vaulting rules. You are responsible for knowing the new rules so read the rulebooks: <https://equestrianvaulting.org/rule-books/>

USEF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

EVUSA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT

EVUSA MEMBERSHIP: All participating vaulters, lungers, horses and coaches must be EVUSA competing members in good standing by the first day of competition. To join or renew go to: <https://equestrianvaulting.org/>

EVUSA NON-MEMBER FEES: Participants who choose to not become members by the first day of competition, must pay the EVUSA non-member fee of \$25 and therefore be allowed to compete and earn ribbons. As a non-EVUSA member, scores earned will not count for end of year awards.

SAFE SPORT TRAINING: All adults who are participating as an official, vaulter, lunger, coach, or booster, must complete Safe Sport Training through USEF prior to the first day of competition. To join or renew go to: <https://www.usef.org/>

ATTENTION COMPETITORS: Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USEF & EVUSA) for horse, owner, rider, lunger, trainer, and coach before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards, and penalty fees will apply.

SAFE SPORT REQUIREMENTS

USEF Safe Sport Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. The Safe Sport toolkit can be found at <https://www.usef.org/safe-sport/competitors>

All EVUSA Adult Participants, defined as any person who has reached their 18th birthday at any time during a sanctioned event or recognized competition and meets any of these conditions: a) registers as a lunger, coach, booster, or vaulter at any EVUSA sanctioned event or recognized competition; or b) is in a role of direct and active engagement with any athlete(s) who is a minor, excluding minors and their parents/guardians) are required to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, EVUSA Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. Management will comply with all MAAP policies and procedures and **all adult participants listed on the Entries, and/or registered for the event must be SafeSport trained as of the first day of competition.**

VERIFICATION THROUGH HORSE SPORT PRO: Participants' SafeSport status must be verifiable via USEF (SafeSport training is available to any USEF competing or subscribing member). Please ensure participant's USEF number is listed in the "NSO Number" information when you register them in the Athletes tab of Horse Sport Pro as this will pull their Safe Sport Training date.

COACHES AND BOOSTERS: List all Coaches and Boosters on the Horse Sport Pro Athletes tab as well as on the Coaches tab, so their Safe Sport training status can be verified. Entry Managers must send the waivers/releases links to all coaches, lungers, boosters, grooms and vaulters.

SEX OFFENDER AND CRIMINAL CONVICTION CLAUSE

Management will not knowingly hire or contract or engage as a volunteer any individual who is on a Sex Offender Registry or has a criminal conviction involving child abuse/neglect, animal cruelty, felony drugs distribution or possession, sexual misconduct, or a violent crime, or anyone suspended, expelled, or banned by the U.S. Center for SafeSport, USEF, or FEI.

MOTOR VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Special Merit Awards

The Colorado State Summer Vaulting Fest is offering three special awards. Nominations are allowed by any participant at the competition. The show committee will select the final winners based on the nominations. Use the QR code or form provided at the competition to nominate for any or all of the awards. Flyers with QR code will be posted in the barns and at the show office.

Each winner will receive a custom grooming tote or similar item donated by HamptonBuilt, hand crafted by Jeffrey Hampton.

Categories and selection criteria are as follows:

CSSVF Sportsmanship Award

The purpose of this award is to give recognition to those of our members who embody the qualities of good sportsmanship. This recipient may be a vaulter, volunteer, coach, lunger, or trainer. Additionally, the recipient must: Abide by the EVUSA Region IV Sportsman Pledge; Demonstrate an ongoing commitment and dedication to the promotion of equestrian sport; Serve as a positive role model for peers; Exhibit characteristics that exemplify positive both sportsmanship and horsemanship principles.

CSSVF Horse Ambassador Award

Colorado State Summer Vaulting Fest will recognize one horse with this award based on the following criteria: 1) Horse is turned out at the highest level in terms of grooming, braiding, and overall cleanliness of equipment; 2) Horse is handled with highest level of care; 3) Horse demonstrates exceptional manners and good behavior; 4) Horse has high level of "vaultability" delivering solid vaulting rounds for vaulters. Competition horse scores may be used as one of the determining criteria. The horse who wins this award should be a model representative of an exceptional vaulting horse, featuring a combination of fitness, manners, turn out, vault ability, and athletic ability.

CSSVF Lunger Merit Award

One lunger will be awarded the CSSVF Lunger of Merit award. This award will be based primarily on the lunger scores from the A3 categories of Freestyle and Technical Test score cards. Top 3 scores will be used along with a category for overall presentation of lunger as determined by show committee. Overall presentation includes: Turn out of lunger, courteousness in the warm-up arena, overall qualities of sportsmanship and horsemanship.

EVUSA HORSE AWARDS REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT

To be eligible for yearly EVUSA horse awards, an additional fee of \$20/annual horse registration or \$85/lifetime horse registration must be paid to the EVUSA. Horses may compete in EVUSA recognized events without horse registration but will be ineligible for annual EVUSA horse awards. Registration must be completed online thru the EVUSA's membership web site (americanvaulting.net > Get Started > Login). Award Points will accumulate from the initial date of horse registration.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the competition management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the competition management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries, and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, rider/vaulter, lunger, coach, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit entry fees and other fees.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of their waste. At least one "sharps" container will be provided for disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. **Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.**

Show management reserves itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

BIOSECURITY RULES AND NOTICES

HORSE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

For all horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the competition grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus (Coggins Test) and Equine Herpesvirus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

For horses traveling from out of state, including those from Colorado, must present a current (within 30 days) health certificate is required.

SUBMITTING PROOF OF HORSE HEALTH:

The Coggins test with proof of negative EIA, Vaccination records, and health certificates are due by end of day Thursday, June 25, emailed to ascentvaulting@gmail.com.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Additional horse health certification may be required based on current USEF or State recommendations. Instructions will be sent to coaches if required. All riders, drivers, vaulters, handlers, owners, trainers, coaches, grooms, agents and lessors must abide by and comply with biosecurity measures and equine health requirements imposed by USEF, Competition Management, and local, state, and federal animal health officials.

The competition will follow current USEF, EVUSA, local and state guidelines regarding health and safety requirements. Individuals who demonstrate non-compliance with USEF, EVUSA, local, state, or Federal rules regarding health requirements will be promptly removed from the competition grounds.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ARENAS: The competition arena is a 200' x 350' indoor arena with a sand mix footing, grandstand seating for approximately 3,000, with a PA system. There will be two or three warm-up circles in the competition arena and one outdoor warm-up arena with sand mix footing available for riding warm-up. Minimum ceiling height of 25' throughout the arena. There is also an outdoor arena available that can be used for hand walking, riding and lunging warm-up. The indoor arena is not available to the competition until after 5:30 p.m. on Friday June 26.

AWARDS: Ribbons will be given to men and women separately in Individual classes overall to 5th place, except as otherwise noted in the class descriptions. Barrel classes are judged with men and women combined; awarded to 10th place. Teams and Pas de Deux will be awarded for overall to 5th place. Additional awards may be provided. Awards ceremony is 30 minutes after the competition on Sunday.

BARRELS/CLUB AREAS: Clubs may bring barrel(s) and mats for the club's use for warm-up, as needed for the club. Space will be provided for barrel and mats behind the grandstands.

BUDDY HORSES: Must held in a bridle and kept within the designated area as directed by paddock or gate manager. Persons holding the horse must show good control and be properly attired with boots or athletic foot wear.

COACHES CHECK-IN: All clubs must send a coach or team rep to the office for check-in on June 27 between 2-7 pm or June 28, 7-8 a.m. **Clubs must check-in PRIOR to any vaulting on horses, including vaulting warm-up. All participants must have signed releases on file prior to vaulting or handling horses on the grounds.**

DRAW: Draw will be done by HorseSportPro on June 3 by the Show Management.

FOOD: Concessions with at least snacks and drinks will be available onsite.

GATE TIMES Please plan to attend all days. Gate times will be adhered to, with the exception of medical emergencies. For smooth running of the competition, competitors should be at the appropriate gate at least 15

minutes before the assigned time. Keep an eye on the competition as classes may be running early. **Competitions may run as much as one hour early.** Any competitor not ready to enter the competition arena at the assigned time may be eliminated from the class. If there is a conflict between horse and barrel performance times, priority goes to the mounted class, and the barrel arena will wait for the go or reorder the OOG to accommodate the horse arena, but vaulters must make arrangements with the barrel arena gate steward to inform them of time conflict.

NUMBERS: Individual and Pas-de-Deux vaulters, and lungers, must wear their EVUSA number in accordance with current EVUSA and USEF rules. Horses must wear their EVUSA number on their bridle. Vaulters and lungers paying EVUSA Non-member fees will be assigned a temporary number. Squad members must wear numbers per EVUSA rules.

ORDER OF GO: OOG/Schedule will be posted through Horse Sport Pro. **The OOG is not accurate until AFTER the DRAW on 6/3.** EVUSA specifications for Order of Go will be followed; unrecognized classes may be "split" if needed.

PARKING/GROUNDS: Parking is free at LCCC. Spectators and general vaulting family vehicles should part in the lot to the west of the indoor arena. Only vehicles pulling the horse trailers or carrying feed or equipment will be allowed down to the barn area.

PETS: Pets must be kept leashed at all times. **Pets are not allowed in the indoor competition arena** with the exception of service animals required for persons with disabilities. (Note: unfortunately this does not include emotional support animals).

PRIZE MONEY: There is no prize money paid at this competition.

RIDING: Riding will be allowed in the outdoor arena. Riding may be allowed in the indoor on Friday, Saturday and Sunday prior to start of competition/timed warm-ups, exiting at least 30 minutes prior to start of day, and may be allowed after competition ends (please check with show office). Availability is dependent on tractor work and ring setup.

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RIDING HEADGEAR: When mounted anywhere on the grounds, riders must wear appropriate footwear and an approved equestrian helmet that meets the requirements of USEF GR801.

SCORING/SCORE CARDS: Scores will be posted through [HorseSport.Pro](https://horsesport.pro). Score cards will be available for pick up at Coaches Check Out.

STABLING: Permanent 12 x 12 box stalls are provided with dirt floors, cinder block walls, and rolling doors with bars on the top half of the doors and walls. Stalls cannot be converted to double stalls. 1 bag of shavings is included in each stall.

VOLUNTEERS: We appreciate our volunteer support to run this competition! Every club is expected to provide volunteer support according to their number of competing vaulters, generally at least one job per vaulter. Sign up link to be sent to club managers after entry deadline. All workers/volunteers entering the competition arena (gate managers, gate assistants,

runners, etc.) should be neatly attired with closed toe shoes. Volunteers on the judges stands (clerks, live scorers) should avoid wearing attire with vaulting club logos or club names.

WARM-UP PRIOR TO COMPETITION: Horse warm-up with vaulters will be available beginning approximately 7 p.m. on Friday in the indoor arena. Horse lunging and vaulting practice is available in the outdoor arena. No EMT is on site on Friday. All vaulting and horse work is at your own risk.

WARM-UP DURING COMPETITION: Only those vaulters and horses on deck or warming up (as directed by the paddock or gate manager) are allowed in the warm-up areas and on-deck area. Vaulters and horses exiting the arena must quickly clear the out gate and not cause a distraction. Do not congregate at the out gate or along the competition arena border. Please move all horses being held to the back of the arena.

ENTRIES, REFUNDS, POST ENTRIES, AND CHANGES

ENTRIES: Entries must be made through <https://horsesport.pro/>. Entry Deadline is May 27, 11:59 p.m. If you experience any issues with registering, email ascentvaulting@gmail.com.

PAYMENTS: Payments must be mailed or electronically submitted by May 28. Preferred payment type is through Paypal, Venmo or Zelle to ascentvaulting@gmail.com. Or send a check payable to Ascent Equestrian Vaulting, mailed to Tiffani Ford, 1733 Rolling Gate Road Fort Collins, CO 80526. Zelle and PayPal sometimes restrict payments to maximum dollar amounts in a single day. Clubs may need to make multiple payments. The first payment must be made on or before May 28. If using PayPal - please mark as Friends & Family. All amounts owed must be received by June 10, 2026, regardless of method of payment, or a late fee of \$50 will be assessed. If PayPal takes a fee away from the payment amount, you will owe that amount at check in. Please email ascentvaulting@gmail.com with how you are paying.

RETURNED CHECKS: There will be a \$50 processing fee for returned checks, and scores for those entries will be voided until payment is received.

LATE PAYMENT FEE: A late fee of \$50 will be assessed for late postmarked/late payment. Late fees of \$10 per form up to \$50 per club will be assessed for late and incorrect paperwork and late releases. Late fees of \$10 per track, up to \$50 per club will be assessed for late, missing or incorrect music.

MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS AND SAFE SPORT TRAINING IN HORSE SPORT PRO: Club Entry Managers MUST check USEF and EVUSA memberships and Safe Sport Training for all participants and be sure 1) All adult participants including vaulters, lungers, coaches, horse owners AND BOOSTERS have current Safe Sport Training completed (and that it shows in HorseSportPro as current) and 2) ALL vaulters, lungers, coaches and horse owners who are entered in USEF classes are USEF competing Members. Horses in USEF classes must be USEF registered. Clubs will be charged \$10 per participant who is missing memberships and/or Safe Sport training by close of Show Office on 6/26, AND the participants must obtain their memberships/complete Safe Sport Training as required by start of competition or will be disqualified with no refunds.

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USEF SHOW PASS: A non-USEF member, who wishes to participate as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, owner, lessee or agent, in the USEF classes, are eligible to obtain no more than one non-member Show Pass per competition year and must pay the requisite fee. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this requirement. The amount of the non-member Show Pass fee will be established annually by the Federation. Payment of Show Pass fees for purposes of competing does not entitle the individual to any other privileges of Federation membership. USEF Show Passes must be purchased no later than end of day on June 26 directly through <https://www.usef.org/show-pass>.

POST ENTRIES: Vaulters may be post entered with a \$100 late registration fee per vaulter in addition to regular registration fee. **Classes** may be post entered with \$100 additional for USEF and EVUSA and \$25 additional for Non-recognized classes.

- **Recognized Class Post Entries:** Post entries must be emailed to ascentvaulting@gmail.com by end of day June 25. No USEF or EVUSA Recognized classes may be post entered after June 25.
- **Non-recognized Class Post Entries: Classes not recognized by USEF or EVUSA** may be post entered at the Show Office at least ½ day (4 hours) before the class start time, with competition management approval based on time availability in the schedule. Additional fees will be due and collectable at Coaches Check out.

CHANGE REQUESTS: Changes to horses or lungers must be made by entry managers through HorseSportPro **prior to entry lock date of June 25**. Email other changes that cannot be made through HorseSportPro to ascentvaulting@gmail.com by end of day June 25, or provide to the show office on the ENTRY CHANGE FORM on June 26 as soon as possible, and no later than 7:00 p.m.

LATE CHANGE FEE: Changes requested after 7 p.m. June 26 will incur a \$20 per vaulter, per class change fee, unless there is a medical, veterinary or safety reason for the change.

REFUNDS: In the case of injury or illness to a vaulter or a horse before the start of the competition, refunds for class fees will be provided, only if show management is notified of the scratch in writing before the competition starts, and appropriate medical documentation is provided. Registration fees are non-refundable. No refunds will be provided for injuries sustained at the competition. Show management reserves the right to decide all issues related to potential refunds. Refunds are processed after the close of the competition and provided to the club via check or electronic payment. In the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds will be issued for class fees. Additional refunds will be at the sole discretion of competition management and will be applied equally across all participants.

MUSIC INSTRUCTIONS

MUSIC IS DUE BY June 12 and must be uploaded through HorseSportPro. Provide music in MP3 format ONLY (No M4A or other formats). You will upload music for your club into [HorseSport.Pro](https://www.horsesportpro.com) entries system once, and then move the files for each vaulter in each class.

Music labels:

- **Run-in music MUST be labelled with “Runin” in the title.** If you use multiple run-ins, label each with the specific information to make it easy to identify (e.g. CEV Trot Squad RUNIN)
- **For Comps and Freestyles** - No specific labelling is required. However, we recommend that you name each track with Club Name, Vaulter Name (for FS/Tech) and Class/Round (e.g. Copper FS).
 - This is in case there are any issues, it can make it easier for the music manager.

I acknowledge that incidents arising out of but not limited to: the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of equipment; inadequate safety measures; and any and all situations beyond the immediate control of the EVUSA and EVUSA Event(s)' organizers and or competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers (collectively, the "Risks").

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the Risks may be caused in whole or in part directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own or others' actions or inactions, or the negligent acts or omissions, including but not limited to gross negligence, of the Released Parties defined below, and I do voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any EVUSA Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my volunteers, employees, vaulters, lungers, or contractors under my direction and control at any EVUSA Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE: I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: the EVUSA; EVUSA subordinates; EVUSA clubs; EVUSA members; EVUSA regions; all event participants (including athletes/vaulters, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel); competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any EVUSA Event; any beneficiary of an EVUSA event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a EVUSA Event may be held; all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the EVUSA Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent, gross or otherwise, acts or omissions of the Released Parties. I agree that I am not entitled to any refund of any money paid by me or on my behalf for my or my minor child's participation in any EVUSA Event(s) unless expressly specified otherwise.

I expressly agree that the foregoing assumption of risk, release of claims and indemnity are intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by law and do hereby voluntarily and knowingly agree to the same. I understand that I have the responsibility to reduce the chance of injury to myself. I hereby acknowledge and understand that LCCC does not have a requirement to eliminate, alter or control the inherent risks of this agricultural, equine, livestock and/or rodeo related activity. By signing below, I hereby acknowledge and agree that I must obey all safety rules and report all injuries to LCCC.

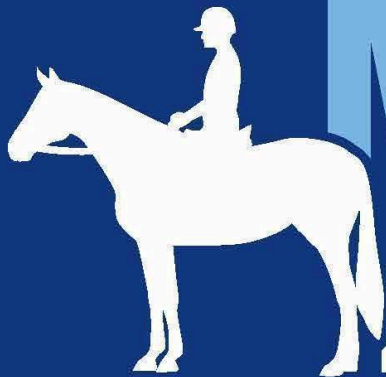
