## **Governing Bodies and Rule Books**

Equestrian Vaulting USA (EVUSA) and United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) have recognized this competition which is hosted by Ascent Equestrian Vaulting, Inc. and Equestrian Vaulting Colorado State University, and the competition is governed by the current rules and regulations of USEF, EVUSA and EVUSA Region 4. Unrecognized classes will be governed by the specifications in this Colorado State Summer Vaulting Fest prize list printed herein. Due to time constraints alternate judges, not listed, may judge unrecognized classes.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All questions not covered in the applicable USEF or EVUSA rules and regulations, or the additional rules in this Prize List, shall be decided by the Show Management and the decision will be final, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Note: There are always many new rules please read the EVUSA rules. You are responsible for knowing the new rules so read the rulebooks: usef.org and equestrianvaulting.org.

## **USEF Membership Statement**

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

## **Membership Requirements**

**USEF Membership:** All vaulters, lungers, horses, horse owners, and coaches in USEF classes must be USEF members in good standing on the first day of competition, June 29, 2024. Riders/vaulters and owners are eligible for one Show Pass per competition year, however, trainers and coaches are not eligible to participate under a Show Pass and must be an Active USEF member, and this includes parents signing as trainers. If a vaulter or owner have not purchased a show pass this competition year they may obtain a show pass/day membership from USEF for \$45, or join as a competing member. **EVUSA Membership:** All participating vaulters, lungers, horses and coaches must be EVUSA members in good standing by the first day of competition June 29, 2024. (To join or renew go to: https://equestrianvaulting.org/)

**EVUSA Non-Member Fees:** Participants who choose to not become members by the first day of competition, must pay the EVUSA non-member fee of \$25 and therefore be allowed to compete and earn ribbons. As a non-EVUSA member, scores earned will not count for end of year awards.

#### SAFE SPORT Reminder

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for Safe Sport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for Safe Sport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

### **Motor Vehicle Statement**

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

## **Music Instructions**

MUSIC: DUE BY June 21. Lyrics (appropriate for children) are allowed at all levels.

- 1. **Provide music in MP3 format ONLY** (No M4A or other formats)
- Runin music <u>must</u> be labelled with "Runin" in the title. If more than one Runin is used for club, label appropriately
- 2. Recommended that you name your music as follows (helps if there are any HorseSportPro issues):
  - Vaulter L Name, F Name, Vaulter Number, Club Abbrev (e.g. CEV), Class title abbrev (e.g. Copper, D Trot, BSquad...), then Class section (e.g. FS, Comps, Tech)
  - Example: Crow Loree JR9 ASC Adult Open FS
- 3. Metatags are not necessary.
- 4. You will upload music for your club one time, and then move the files for each vaulter in each class. One person in your club should be appointed to handle the music.

## **Rules and Regulations**

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries, and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of their waste. At least one "sharps" container will be provided for disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

#### HORSE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

Negative Coggins and a current (within 30 days) health certificate is required <u>for horses traveling from out of state</u>. Additional horse health certification will be required based on **current USEF** 

**recommendations**, and form(s.) Instructions will be sent to coaches if required.

#### COVID-19 SPECIAL RULES/NOTICES

The competition will follow current USEF, local and state guidelines regarding health and safety requirements. Individuals may choose to wear a face covering/mask even when not required. Anyone choosing to do so will not be penalized.

Individuals who demonstrate non-compliance with USEF, EVUSA, local, state, or Federal rules regarding health requirements will be promptly removed from the competition grounds.

## **General Information**

ARENAS: The competition arena is 150' **x** 300' indoor arena with sand/clay mix footing, grandstand seating for approximately 3,000, and an announcer's stand with PA system. There will be two or three warm-up circles in the competition arena and one outdoor warm-up arena with sand mix footing available for riding warm-up. There is also a smaller arena available in the stabling barn that can be used for hand walking and lunging warm-up – ABSOLUTELY NO VAULTERS

allowed on the horses in the small warm-up in the barn, due to low ceiling height.

AWARDS: Ribbons will be given to men and women separately in Individual classes overall to 5<sup>th</sup> place. Barrel classes are judged with men and women combined; awarded to 5<sup>th</sup> place. Teams and Pas de Deux will be placed to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Additional awards per management decision.

BARRELS/CLUB AREAS: Clubs may bring barrel(s) and mats for the club's use for warm-up, as needed for the club. Space will be provided for barrel and mats.

BUDDY HORSES must be held in a bridle and kept within the designated area.

FOOD: Concessions will be available onsite provided by a food truck, to be announced. If not food truck concessionaire is available, water and snacks will be sold by the competition.

GATE TIMES Please plan to attend all days. Gate times will be adhered to, with the exception of medical emergencies. For smooth running of the competition, competitors should be at the appropriate gate at least 10 minutes before the assigned time. Keep an eye on the competition as classes may be running early. Any competitor not ready to enter the competition arena at the assigned time may be eliminated from the class. If there is a conflict between horse and barrel performance times, preference goes to the mounted class, but vaulters must make arrangements with the barrel arena gate steward.

#### HORSE WARM-UP PRIOR TO COMPETITION:

Horse warm-up with vaulters will be available in the competition circle beginning approximately 4 PM on Friday (depending on number of horses registered). Sign-up sheet will be sent to coaches. Additional horse warm-up will be available on Friday starting around 1:00 p.m. in B.W. Pickett arena. Horse lunging with no vaulters is available in the small arena in the barn area.

NUMBERS Individual and Pas-de-Deux vaulters, and lungers, must wear their EVUSA number in accordance with current EVUSA and USEF rules. Horses must wear their EVUSA number on their bridle. Vaulters and lungers paying EVUSA Nonmember fees will be assigned a temporary number. Squad members must wear numbers per EVUSA rules.

PARKING/GROUNDS: Parking is free on Saturday and Sunday. Parking permits are required on Friday, and permits must be requested for each car parked. Parking permits may be acquired in the show office on Friday. Additional instructions will be emailed to all participants.

PETS: Dogs are allowed and must be kept leashed at all times.

PRIZE MONEY: There is no prize money paid at this competition.

RIDING: There is an outdoor arena available for riding, and riding will be allowed in the Indoor Arena on Friday, times to be announced. When mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, riders must wear appropriate footwear and properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag, properly fitted with harness secured.

STABLING: Permanent 14 x 14 box stalls are provided with stall mats on the floors, solid walls, and rolling doors with bars on the top half of the doors. Stalls cannot be converted to double stalls. 1 bag of shavings is included in each day/night stall. Horse Stalls may need to be fully stripped into the manure pile after competition. \$50 per stall will be assessed if the stall is not adequately stripped.

WARM-UP DURING COMPETITION: Only those competitors on deck or warming up (as directed by the gate steward) are allowed in the warm-up areas and on-deck area. Competitors exiting the arena must yield to entering competitors and quickly clear the on-deck area. We appreciate everyone's help in keeping the competition area free of congestion.

VOLUNTEER JOBS: It is required that each club takes one volunteer job for each vaulter registered. Independent vaulters must fill one volunteer job. Sign up by June 21 via <a href="https://horsesportPro">HorseSportPro</a>

## **Entries, Payments, Refunds and Late Fees**

All Entries MUST be made through Horse Sport Pro: there is a medical, veterinary or safety reason for the by May 31, end of day. If you experience any issues with registering, email ascentvaulting@gmail.com.

Payments must be mailed or electronically submitted **by June 3.** Preferred by Paypal to ascentvaulting@gmail.com or Zelle to ascentvaulting@gmail.com. Or check payable to Ascent Equestrian Vaulting, mailed to Loree Crow, 26134 County Road 62 ½, Greeley, Colorado 80631.

**Late fees:** A late fee of \$50 will be assessed for late postmarked/late payment. Late fees of \$5 per form up to \$50 per club will be assessed for late and incorrect paperwork. Late fees of \$5 per track, up to \$50 per club will be assessed for late, missing or incorrect music.

**Post Entries:** Vaulters may be post entered with a \$50 late registration fee per vaulter and \$50 additional class entry fee in addition to regular fees. Post entries and class add requests should be emailed to ascentvaulting@gmail.com before 5 p.m. June 26. Additional fees will be due and collectable at Coaches Check In. Additional FunFest classes may be entered at the Show Office and must be made at least 4 hours before the class start time. No USEF/EVUSA classes may be post entered after 5:00 p.m. June 26.

**Change Requests:** ALL requests for changes to entries, including adding classes, changing horses or lungers, changing team vaulters, or Order of Go changes after close of entries MUST be received by Show Management in writing. Email ascentvaulting@gmail.com with changes by June 26 5 p.m. Changes requested after 8 p.m. June 28: will incur a \$10 per vaulter/class change fee unless

change.

**Refunds:** In the case of injury or illness to a participant or a horse before the start of the competition, refunds will be provided minus a \$25 processing fee, only if show management is notified of the scratch in writing before the competition starts, and appropriate medical documentation is provided.

No refunds will be provided for injuries sustained at the competition. Show management reserves the right to decide all issues related to potential refunds whether due to documented changes in entries or incorrect assessment of fees. Refunds are processed after the close of the competition and provided to the club via mail or by check provided at the competition.

**Returned Checks:** There will be a \$50.00 processing fee for returned checks, and scores for those entries will be voided until payment is received.

Composite Teams: All composite teams must fill out the EVUSA composite team form and submit their registration paperwork. Form may be submitted at Coaches Check in.

**Draw:** Draw will be done by HorseSportPro on June 3 by the Show Management.

Coaches Check-in: All clubs must send a coach or team rep to the office for check-in on June 28 between 3-8 pm or June 29 between 7-8 a.m.

**Order of Go**: EVUSA specifications for Order of Go (Standing Rules for Recognized Competitions) will be followed, with the exception that unrecognized classes may be "split" so that not all competitors go together, at the discretion of management.

## **Class Rules**

All USEF Classes are run in accordance with current USEF rule book. EVUSA Recognized/National Classes are run in accordance with the current EVUSA Rule Books.
